

CAMPUS SAFETY AND SECURITY

The UM Department of Public Safety and Security has state certified police officers, public safety officers, and parking enforcement officers who patrol the campus area. These officers are supported by communications officers, administrators, and investigators. Public Safety is a service-oriented department whose mission is to contribute to and promote a safe and secure community while respecting the rights and dignity of all persons utilizing facilities and programs of the UM.

The Department of Public Safety distributes the University's Campus Safety Handbook and Annual Security Report. These reports include statistics for the previous three years concerning reported crimes that occurred on campus; in certain off-campus buildings or property owned or controlled by UM; and on public property within, or immediately adjacent to and accessible from, the campus. The reports also include institutional policies concerning campus security, such as policies concerning alcohol and drug use, crime prevention, the reporting of crimes, sexual assault, and other matters. FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT (FERPA)

In carrying out their assigned responsibilities, many offices at the University of Michigan collect and maintain information about students. Although these records belong to the University, both University policy and federal law accord students a number of rights concerning these records. The Federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) establishes the rules and regulations regarding access to and disclosure of student records.

To fulfill FERPA requirements, the University has established a Student Rights and Student Records policy. This policy outlines a student's rights regarding his/her records, where records about the student may be kept and maintained, what kinds of information are in those records, the conditions under which the student or anyone else may have access to information in those records, and what action a student can take if it is believed that the information in his/her record is inaccurate or that the student's rights have been compromised. Because the University does not maintain all student records in one location, each office that maintains student records is required by the UM Regents to develop a written statement of its policies and procedures for handling those records; these

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statements are available for students to examine in the respective offices. In addition, copies of the University's "Policies on Student Records" and the pertinent federal law, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA), are posted on the bulletin board outside the Registrar's Office and are also available in all Deans' offices (see School/College contact information at www.umich.edu/units.html).

REFUND POLICY: The University has a Tuition Refund Policy that stipulates the amount of tuition and fees that are refunded to a student who withdraws from all classes during a term. WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURES: Students who are withdrawing from all classes at the University must notify the Registrar's Office by following specific withdrawal procedures posted on the web at www.umich.edu/~regoff/termwd.html. Graduate Business, Dental, Law, and Medical students must contact their respective financial aid office, at left.

REPAYMENT POLICY (RETURN OF TITLE IV AID):

The federal government mandates that students who withdraw from all classes may only keep the financial aid (Federal "Title IV" grant and loan assistance) they have "earned" up to the time of withdrawal. Funds that were disbursed in excess of the earned amount must be returned by the University and/or the student to the federal government. COMPLETION/GRADUATION RATES

The UM graduation rate after six years for the 1996-97 freshman class is 84%. This is the rate for degree-seeking full-time undergraduates who have graduated from their programs within 150% of the normal time for graduation.
